The Way- What is God doing?

Sermon Notes June 25, 2017

Illustration: Falsely accused in Hershey.

- Fear grips you—will you lose your job? Lose your career? Go to jail?
- Anger comes next—this is not right! That is not the truth!
- Defense begins.
- Questions come: "What are you doing God?"

Paul's mission misunderstood by his peers. Acts 21:1-16

- Spirit-filled people urged Paul to not go to Jerusalem. (4)
 - Not likely a command of the Spirit to go to Jerusalem thus making Paul disobedient to God.
 - Likely the Spirit revealed to them what Paul was going to face in Jerusalem thus urging him to not go. EBC
 - o Similar to Jesus being discouraged from going to Jerusalem by many godly people.
- A former partner in the ministry Agabus prophetically prepares Paul for being arrested by the Romans. (10-11)
- Again godly people are begging him to not go to Jerusalem. (12)
- Paul is prepared to die for Jesus in Jerusalem—he is prepared! (13b)

Paul takes all precautionary steps. Acts 21:17-26

- Pleasantries...They exchange stories of God's work through the disciples among the Jews in Jerusalem and God's work through Paul among the Gentiles. (19-20)
- Concerns...Paul's reputation has been ruined among the Jews under false pretenses. (21)
- Precautionary response in fear...Take a Nazarite vow and pay for others to do the same. That should work. (23-24)
 - o This would be seen as a zealous practice of the law.
 - Great idea but it does not work.

The power of a false accusation. Acts 21:27-32

- He was falsely accused of teaching against the law, the Jews, and against the temple. (28)
 - o Truth is, Paul worshiped in the temple.
 - o Paul affirmed the law. Romans 7:7-25
 - Paul loved the Jews. **Romans 9:2-4a** "I have great sorrow and unceasing anguish in my heart. For I could wish that I myself were cursed and cut off from Christ for the sake of my people, those of my own race the people of Israel..."
 - He was willing to go to the greatest ends to win both Jew and Gentile. 1 Corinthians
 9:20
- He was falsely accused of taking a gentile into the holy place that is for Jews only. (29)
- Paul is indeed bound by the Romans and led out of the mob. (33)

Paul's defense. Acts 22:3-21

- I am a Jew's Jew. (3)
 - o Grew up in Jerusalem.
 - o Taught by Gamaliel.
 - o Zealous in his adherence to the Law and forcing others to do the same.
- I met Jesus.
 - While on his way to persecute The Way.
 - o Jesus transformed his heart and mind immediately.
- Commissioned by Jesus to go to the Gentiles. (21)
- His testimony is rejected! (22)

Where is God?

- He was there in preparing Paul for what lie ahead...not safe but best place to be.
- This moment of chaos and false accusation led to the platform of sharing the gospel with key leaders both Roman and Jew—brilliant move by God.
- His mission for Paul remained to the gentiles, and Jerusalem was merely the launching pad to that end. God was consistent with his calling upon Paul's life.

Take Aways

- 1. God is right there with you and is bringing about his great purposes.
- 2. His ways are not always discernable and may never be.
- 3. Staying the course of God's mission is as Ed pointed out last week, not the safest place to be but the best place to be.
